Wausa's Preliminary Proposal for an Initial Cooperative Agreement Prior to Nov. 1st

- 1. Wausa and Osmond will agree to join a cooperative Agreement. This agreement shall be for for four years, with the renewal planning phase to begin no later than mid cycle of the agreement for the next round of agreement.
- 2. Both schools will commit to a joint FFA program, and will look at options and opportunities for other joint academic programs and opportunities. The first meeting shall be no later than January to propose and commit to this program.
- 3. Osmond Community Schools and Wausa Public Schools shall be referred to as the "Osmond Tigers" for wrestling, both in High School and Junior high, for the four year cycle, with the colors being Orange and Black. Osmond shall be the host school for the wrestling cooperative agreement.
- 4. Osmond Community Schools and Wausa Public Schools shall be referred to as the "Wausa Vikings" for Football, both in High School and Junior high, for the four year cycle, with the colors being purple and gold. Wausa shall be the host school for the football cooperative agreement.
- 5. All wrestling meets and practices shall be held at Osmond Community schools.
- All varsity practices and football games shall be held at Wausa Public schools.
 One home game shall be in Osmond, for the purposes of Osmond's annual homecoming. JV and Junior High games can be negotiated.
 - a. Both schools shall commit to a full Junior Varsity (JV) Schedule, to allow students the opportunity to compete and grow at their appropriate age and skill level.
 - b. Both schools shall commit to a full Junior High Football schedule, including a "B" game extra quarter, to allow students the opportunity to compete and grow at their appropriate age and skill level.
- 7. During the 4 year agreement, Wausa and Osmond will commit to Joint strategic planning between the two school districts, to continue to research other opportunities for the future, to ensure that a long term planning process takes place and a long term relationships continues to be fostered between the two districts. Both schools will have no fewer than two joint meetings annually, with no fewer than 2 additional committee meetings annually.
